Where do we come from? The physical, seen world and everything and everyone in it, as well as the invisible, unseen realm was created by the one true God. Genesis 1-2, Job 38:4-7

NARRATIVE OF HISTORY

What is the overarching narrative of history? The overarching narrative of history surrounds the coming of the Deliverer, the Son of God come to earth, Jesus Christ. History can be summarized in this way: Creation, Corruption, Covenant, Christ, Cross, Church, Consummation. IDENTITY

Who are we? Who we are (our identity) cannot be rightly understood apart from our Maker. What we know from God's Word (the Bible) is that all people are finite beings that God lovingly made, male or female, in His image to be in relationship with Him and to represent Him on earth for His glory. Humans were to multiply in that identity. When sin came into world, it broke everything. Relationship with God was lost thus human identity was corrupted and became confusing. We are either with God in heaven or apart from Him for in Hell for all eternity based on whether or not we have a relationship with Him (refer to Identity).
