The Scriptures Summarized / Book 16 — Nehemiah

Nehemiah was the <u>cupbearer</u> to the King of Persia, whose palace was in the citadel of <u>Susa</u>. He would <u>serve</u> the king his meals and beverages. This meant that he was a <u>trusted</u> confidant and <u>bodyguard</u> too. It was his responsibility to <u>pre-taste</u> anything the king consumed to protect against poisoning.

Likely because of this job, he had not <u>returned</u> home with the first 2 remnants recorded in Ezra. He did, however, know some of those who had <u>relocated</u> including Hanani. This <u>brother</u> came back for a visit and informed Nehemiah about the desperate <u>conditions</u> of those repopulating Jerusalem. The city had no <u>walls</u> or <u>gates</u> for protection against military attack.

Nehemiah was a <u>politically</u> wise man of <u>organization</u>, initiative and <u>courage</u>. He considered this <u>vulnerability</u> of his hometown both <u>upsetting</u> and unacceptable. He prayed and <u>fasted</u> that God might allow him to use his strategic <u>access</u> to the king to lobby for the repair and rebuild of Jerusalem's defenses.

God answered this prayer by having the king <u>initiate</u> the conversation. He noticed the change in Nehemiah's <u>demeanor</u>. This was the open opportunity for the <u>suggestion</u> of a royally approved and financed <u>assignment</u>.

This restoration project was approved during the <u>20th</u> year of King Artaxerxes reign (2:1). Nehemiah led the rebuilding of the wall, completed in only <u>52</u> days despite deceitful <u>opposition</u> (6:15). Nehemiah stayed on as acting governor. Apparently, he didn't return back to <u>Babylon</u> for another <u>12</u> years (13:6). Ezra joined Nehemiah in bringing <u>revival</u> to the people of God by <u>instructing</u> them from the Word of God.

Nehemiah 6:15 So the wall was completed on the twenty-fifth of Elul, in fifty-two days.

Nehemiah 8:8 They read from the Book of the Law of God, making it clear and giving the meaning so that the people understood what was being read.
